

SDM accused of demanding Rs 30,000 bribe

MPHRC serves notice to collector on the complaint of the nurse

A nurse posted with Gohargaj primary health centre accused the SDM of harassment. She also made a complaint with the State Women's Commission. In her complaint the nurse alleged that SDM Goharganj harassed her through various ways.

According to sources, Bhagwan Singh Vishwakarma of Gudraitola, on August 3, 2010, had alleged that a nurse posted with the community centre, Annamma Samuel, was demanding money for discharging his daughter. Later the nurse, in her explanation said that just after an hour of the admission of the patient in the hospital, the family was pressuring her to discharge the patient, which was not possible. Later, the district collector had ordered an enquiry in this matter under SDM Goharganj, Sanjay Singh. According to the nurse, the SDM openly demanded Rs 30,000 and when she denied he threatened to send her jail. On August 13,

the nurse lodged a written complaint to the State Human Rights Commission, State Women Commission and to the Raisen collector.

Taking the matter into cognisance, MPHRC has served a notice to the collector in this regard. The collector has again ordered an enquiry under additional collector.

The nurse alleged that when she reached the office of the additional collector for giving her statement, he was busy in some interview and given the charge to SDM Sanjay Singh who has forcefully taken the statement and signatures.

On October 30, the nurse again reached MPHRC and complained about what has happened with her. MPHRC again issued notice and sought answers till March 23. Now, the nurse has alleged that she is being pressurised by various means to take back the complaint. Sources said that Sanjay Singh is under scanner now.

“No one is taking my complaint seriously and they are also pressurising me to withdraw my complaints.”
